One day, as the boss leaves, ShuShu falls asleep over his work...

As he wakes up, he sees the restaurant filled with weird waitresses, cooks and a cashier, and to his surprise each one of them seems to treat him like the boss. Even Chalablab approaches him with respect and obeys his orders!

But just as the cooks are preparing a delicious meal for ShuShu with flying pans and torches, the gang of the town comes in as usual, flipping everything around, breakdancing over tables and chairs, and starting, as usual, a huge fight with on of the old regular guests. Things are getting out of hand, but what ShuShu didn't expect is that an unusual fancy guest will come to dine tonight, the slaughtered chicken becomes a swan and that money has power and he will end up in prison after an investigation by the massive police parade.

Will the crew save him with an air demonstration?
